Getting a Dog Park Permit

For the safety of dog park users and their dogs, an annual permit is needed for those wishing to use the dog parks. Dog park permits can be purchased in person at Isle a la Cache Museum (Romeoville), Monee Reservoir (Monee), Plum Creek Nature Center (Beecher) or Sugar Creek Administration Center (Joliet), or by mailing this application form with payment to Sugar Creek Administration Center. Applicants may register up to three dogs. Permits are valid from the date of issue until December 31 of that calendar year. Permit fees are outlined below. See reverse side for payment information and rules.

Mail this form with payment to Sugar Creek Administration Center, 17540 W. Laraway Road, Joliet, Illinois 60433. You will receive a permit and ID lanyard for use at any of the dog parks within 5-10 business days. The ID lanyard must be worn at all times while using the dog parks.

Rules of the Dog Parks

1. As a condition of this permit, you are subject to all rules and regulations contained in General Use Ordinance No. 124, the Illinois Criminal Code, the Illinois Vehicle Code, and the Illinois Game and Fish Codes. Falsification of information or violation of any rules, regulations or ordinances of the District will result in the denial and/or revocation of this permit, forfeiture of fees, fines and/or closing of the event.
2. Entry into the dog park without the appropriate permit will result in a fine and removal from the park.
3. Permit holders are required to wear the ID lanyard when in the dog parks. Failure to do so may result in permit revocation and removal from the park. Photo reproduction of passes will not be accepted.
4. Permit holders may have no more than three dogs in the dog park at one time.
5. All dogs present must be registered with the District with a current rabies tag number and expiration date.
6. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to notify the District with updated rabies tag number and expiration date information.
7. Dogs must display a current rabies tag while in the Dog Park.
8. Permit holders who foster dogs must notify the District if the dog associated with their permit changes.
9. This permit is not transferable. Any attempted transference or attendance violation will void the dog park permit and subject the holder to fines, penalties and loss of fees.
10. Permit holders must clean up after their dogs in both the dog park and the preserve. This includes any waste as well as water bowls and dog toys.
11. Puppies 6 months of age or younger are prohibited.
12. Leave unhealthy dogs and those in heat at home.
13. Dogs must be leashed when entering and exiting the dog parks. Dogs in a preserve must be leashed if they are outside of the dog park area. Leashes in excess of 10 feet are not allowed.
14. Owners must remain with their dogs inside the fenced dog park and keep their dogs under control at all times.
15. You must remove your dog immediately from the dog park at the first sign of aggressive behavior. Dogs are not allowed to disturb, harass, or interfere with wildlife or other visitors.
16. Dog park permits are issued to adults (18 years or older) only and the pass holder must be present with their dog in the park.
17. All dog park permits expire at the end of the calendar year (Dec. 31, 2017).
18. The District assumes no liability for any injuries that occur as a result of your activity.

By signing below, I agree to abide by all of the rules listed here and as posted at the dog parks to ensure the safety of my dog and other users of the dog parks. I recognize that the use of the dog parks may entail certain risk, injury or loss to dogs and people and I assume full responsibility for any injuries, damages and expenses that I, my dog or other dogs accompanying me might sustain while using this facility or any person or dog might sustain as a result of my dog's actions. I agree not to hold the Forest Preserve District of Will County liable for any loss or damage to persons or property arising from my use of the facilities or engaging in the activity for which this permit is granted. I agree to defend and hold harmless the Forest Preserve District of Will County and any associated parties for any and all claims or actions brought by myself, my heirs, my guests, contractors or invitees as a result of the exercise of the rights granted under this permit. Rules/regulations references to "owner" include the person responsible for the dog while at the dog park, whether or not that person is the legal owner of the dog.
